**2. OBJECTIFS DU MODULE**

The aim of this course is two-fold:

- To explain grammatical rules that govern English and how they are used in context;
- To enable students to bridge the gap between knowing grammatical structures and using them effectively.

The course is built around a context-based grammar. After an overview of traditional lists of rules, students are introduced to grammar in context, using authentic texts taken from various sources, such as newspapers, literary texts, and publications on contemporary issues. The main advantages for students to explore grammar in context include: (1) enabling them to bridge the gap between language study and language use; (2) offering them the opportunity to be exposed to grammar in its contexts of use, giving examples of real language use; and (3) helping them to become active, confident, and autonomous learners.

**2. OBJECTIFS DU MODULE**

The objective of this course is to enable students to learn to write effective paragraphs, master essential sentence skills, and read critically. These skills will prepare them to tackle many types of writing in college and beyond. Along the way, however, there are many other important skills to explore and develop: using specific and concrete language to make a point and stick to it, selecting good supporting details to back up that point and create a convincing argument, organizing a paragraph in a way that best fits its purpose, and writing clear, error-free sentences to maximize the effectiveness of the writing. The course also aims at consolidating the student’s skills in sentence types and structures; initiating the student to the paragraph mechanics and paragraph structure; developing the student’s skills in paragraph writing; and initiating the student to type of paragraphs (Descriptive, Narrative, and Process). The focus will be more on the activity of writing than on theoretical lecturing.

**2. OBJECTIFS DU MODULE**

In order to strengthen comprehension, students need to follow some steps and to acquire some skills. The first thing to do is to read and reread the text. Students must read slowly so as to fully engage themselves in the spirit of the text. Therefore, this module aims to enable the students to the basic skills of reading comprehension through a variety of comprehension texts.

Students can increase comprehension by paying attention to the use of the author of punctuation, his choice of words, his choice of word structures. The use of dictionaries and glossaries give the opportunity to students to understand meanings of words and to learn more synonyms, which they can use when paraphrasing or summarizing.

Students will be asked to read texts from three to five paragraphs to read and answer comprehension questions.

These questions are meant to check students' level of comprehension proportionate to the content of the text. Two categories of comprehension questions will be addressed; direct questions and multiple-choice questions.

This module also enables students to summarize short texts by focusing on the main points.

For precis, which literally refers to short forms of texts that give only the important parts, students are required to summarize certain selected paragraphs. This task is done by means of eliminating - unless important - details, examples, statistics, names, dates... To summarize is to condense the original text, highlighting only the main points necessary for the understanding of - particularly - a new reader. In length, a précis is shorter than the original paragraph, in this context.

This module is based more on practice. Selected texts are analyzed and studied in class. Students' collaboration and active participation is a key requirement. Exercises include comprehension questions, vocabulary exercises, paraphrasing, summarizing and selecting the main ideas of the passage. The students are supposed to read the corresponding material in either the texts that will be assigned to them or the additional readings before coming to class, so that they will be prepared to discuss it. Students are expected to read extensively outside class, be well prepared, contribute to class discussions and participate in student-centered activities in pairs and small groups. **2. OBJECTIFS DU MODULE**

**Spoken English Course** Is designed to make students more conscious of the actual functioning of spoken English: its stress and its pronunciation; the course is also intended to practice and improve the students' ability to speak English and to listen to and understand spoken English. The course consists one and half lesson each week which is taught in small groups to encourage as much individual active participation by the students as possible. The course involves practical oral work of a more theoretical nature. The theoretical work consists of:

- Phonetics: the phonetic alphabet will be introduced and there will be considerable practice in the use of phonetic transcription; by the end of the year, the students should be able to use phonetic transcription.
- Word stress: students will learn how to distinguish patterns of stress in different words. These words will also be transcribed in phonetics.
- Sentence stress: students will learn how to distinguish and reproduce the stress patterns used in English sentences; these sentences will also be transcribed into phonetics.
- The practical work will include discussions, debates, oral comprehension, dictation and note-taking.

Based on the above objectives, the content of the course will be devised as follows:

Concerning pronunciation, vowels as well as consonants will constitute the core of the first and second semesters' listening and speaking course. In this respect, students will be introduced to the International Phonetic Alphabet as a reference against which vowels and consonants will be categorized for phonetic transcription.

As for functions, the course will include openings and closings, introductions, invitations, apologizing, giving compliments and replying to compliments, requesting, making offers, etc. Idiomatic expressions will be presented in the context in which they could be used. This will be achieved through teaching conversations in which the targeted idioms will be incorporated. Discussion topics will be based on readings, proverbs, and video clips. Through these, the learners will be encouraged to discuss the values and assumptions of the British and American cultures.

Finally, all the above components will be stressed by listening tasks which ultimately would lead learners to improve their listening strategies, and by implication improve their speaking strategies as well.

NB: the book of English pronunciation in use series is highly recommended.

This module aims to develop students' ability to understand and analyze various types of texts. The students are expected to be able to read with a large degree of independence, adapting style and speed of reading to different texts and purposes, and using appropriate reference sources selectively. Students should be able to read texts critically. Therefore, students will be asked to read a lot and different texts belonging to different registers will be assigned to them. They will develop their reading comprehension skills to understand specialized articles. Students will learn how to use a dictionary whenever confusion or misunderstanding occurs. They will be able to identify, interpret and critically analyze different types of text types, styles and registers.

The aim of this course intends to:

- Enable students to achieve fluency in the areas of vocabulary recognition and reading comprehension skills;
- Equip students with effective extensive reading strategies;

This course is primarily a skills course. It addresses the following issues: skills required from a good translator, translation strategies, steps to follow while translating, and the points to avoid while translating. It also introduces students to various types of texts, ranging from simple, general interest texts to specialized, more complex ones, dealing with business, tourism, international organizations, and mass media. Students are introduced to basic translation skills, and are trained in-class to translate various texts. Home and class assignments are weekly and constitute an important part of the course. Therefore, this course will cover the following :

- General introduction to the course (content, objectives, expectations, assessment method, etc.);
- Reminder of basic theoretical concepts (meaning transfer, equivalence, fidelity, encoding, decoding, etc.);
- The differences and similarities between Arabic and English;
- Translation practice;
- Collective correction and discussion of written test / Feedback
- The Do's don'ts in interpretation from English into Arabic and from Arabic to English
- Use of monolingual and bilingual dictionaries in translation
- The Fundamentals of Translation Process
- Characteristics of legal discourse and translation of legal texts (in-class practice)
- Translation Practice (legal Texts)

**18. OBJECTIFS DU MODULE**

This course provides a wide-ranging examination of African literature and culture, outlining the multitude of voices, experiences, and histories that define the continent's literary heritage. Students will be presented with a selection of texts—including novels, poetry, drama, and oral traditions—while analytically investigating the socio-political, historical, and cultural contexts from which these works emanate.

**Literary Analysis and Critical Thinking**

- Analyze major themes, narrative techniques, and stylistic elements in representative works from different African literary traditions
- Evaluate how African authors use literature to address social, political, and cultural issues
- Compare and contrast literary movements across different African regions and time periods
